An approach to ceramics that goes beyond convention to bring life to authentic "new design" sculptures.

The art exhibition devoted to the most iconic ceramic design works – curated in partnership with Antonia Jannone Disegni di Architettura - was officially opened to the public on 10 January at the Iris Ceramica Group Flagship Store in via Santa Margherita 4 in Milan. An exhibition of twenty-three ceramic works created by twelve artists and designers, which can be visited (reservation required) until 18 February 2022.

Aldo Cibic, Alessandro Mendini, Andrea Branzi, Ettore Sottsass, George Sowden, Luigi Serafini, Marco Zanini, Martine Bedin, Matteo Thun, Michele De Lucchi, Nathalie Du Pasquier, Peter Shire: authors who have showcased the ability to rewrite the rules, creating unique pieces that have become a symbol of "new design": a benchmark for contemporary avant-garde movements internationally.

7 of Ettore Sottsass' works are on display, from the series *The Indian Memory*, an original experimentation of forms pushed to the limits of technical possibilities, half-way between architecture and sculpture, with a strong emotional component.

Aldo Cibic is represented by his *Italian Landscape*, a composition of hand-finished pieces, perfectly arranged connections of forms and colours, while the two impressive, post-modern vases *Criso* and *Elgin*, with their undisputed coloured charm and soft curves, are part of the collection *12 Colonne* by Alessandro Mendini.

Andrea Branzi helps to rewrite ceramic design with two surprising works, *Bosco* and *Portale*, a dialogue between the natural and artificial. Luigi Serafini tells of a blend of opposing elements with *Nessi*, the perfect mix of geometry and sinuosity, and the white ceramic work *Senza titolo* e senza testa: a uniquely irreverent re-interpretation of ceramics.
